

Best beoff

1. The best place is 40 ft by 24 ft 12 feet Pitch. 3/4 between trees. 21 ft. frame of oak, gum or pine. Covered with cypress shingles. - sometimes, Lloyd houses thatched with Rye straw; roof lasting for 7 to 10 years.
2. a floor would not injure, if you do not fire. Ventilation is careful when not fired.
3. Some distance from other buildings if you fire. If you do not fire, no matter in what convenient place they are placed.
5. It is best to fire. If you wish to have it very nice it must be fired 5 days - when it gets green the appearance of a hickory leaf it must be forced for 24 hours and carefully examined to, night & day. 4 kinds of wood sufficient for curing the contents of a barn as above. Considerable loss of wt. by firing. The gain in ^{100 lb. ch.} is about - making 3 sorts. Hickory, Gum & Sycamore ^{but must be carefully} selected.
5. Light sandy loam is best. The soil must be yellow clay bottom best. White clay soil is best to produce spotted tobacco. Red oak & Hickory soil the best. The Hills are best for the best quality tobacco. Valleys between hills are good if they are not moist if they are, the tobacco is not so good to spot.
7. The land with that will bring 15 Bar. of what is low, or 20 Bar com is worth cultivating tobacco without manure. There it will take 5000 hills to the Acre of tobacco.
