Dear Sir

Your favor of 13<sup>th</sup> inst is at hand this morning and in answer I have to say that I cannot combine the acct. of W<sup>m</sup> H. De Conroy W. R. with the one against his Father's Estate, as the two accts have always been kept separate.

You will probably recollect that when you called at my store in August last, during my absence in Europe, you then saw the acct. of W. H. De Conroy as it stands in my Ledger and that you then saw that there had been a settlement on 18<sup>th</sup> May 1846, when he paid \$5.93<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, which squared his acct. to Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> 1846. Since when all articles ordered by him have been regularly charged, as before. I enclose you a statement of his acct. as it now stands. I ask to W. H. De C. for payment of this bill and not to the Administrator of W<sup>m</sup> H. De Conroy, and wish you to act accordingly, in what manner you may think best. I enclose you a statement of W<sup>m</sup> H. De Conroy's acct, which I wish brought to a settlement. Please do me the favor to collect the enclosed bills against W<sup>m</sup> De Conroy and W<sup>m</sup> Dangafuld. Your prompt attention to the above will much oblige you
