Your favor dated March - 1835 -

was rec^d. the night previous to my leaving home for
Baltimore, where I remained nearly a week, or it would
have been immediately answered, at least, as soon, as the
necessary copies could be made to enable me to give you
the information which you desire. - An answer now has been
undelayed longer than I could have wished, in conse-
-quence of my having leisure only of a night to attend to
my private business, and most of the copies and statements
now furnished, could not well be made by any person ^{than} except
myself. - There has been no disposition ^{to} ~~withhold~~ ^{conceal} from the inspection of any persons interested in the
business under my charge to which your letter particularly
relates; but on the contrary I have at all times been prepared
to make an exhibit of my agency and to give any informa-
-tion in regard to it, in my power. - The papers now com-
-menced, (and which it is my particular desire should be
submitted to the inspection of Geo. Goldsborough, since I hope
from satisfactory, should however, a more minute detail
be required, in any respect, it will be furnished with the ut-
-most promptness. - I have not thought it necessary to carry
the statements back beyond a period when the hire of
the servants came into my hands (say for the year 1831. as
it was applied previously to that period to the liquidation
of the liens upon them in Mississippi, and for which they
would have unquestionably been sold but for my timely ar-
