

In the name of God, I Thomas Emory of Queen Anne's County, in the state of Maryland, being in feeble health of body, but of sound & disposing mind, memory & understanding, considering the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs before it shall ^{please} God to call me hence, do therefore make & publish this my last will & testament in manner & form following: That is to say,

First, and principally, I Commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named; and as to my worldly affairs goods I give devise & bequeath the same as follows.

Item 1. I give devise & bequeath to my dear wife Anna Emory for & during the term of her natural life the farm whereon I reside called Poplar Grove, comprising several tracts or parts of tracts of land severally called Conquest, Brampton & Corsica, part of which was devised to me by the will of my father, and part of which was purchased of the heirs of Edward Brown, & a small part of William T. Kingdon in his life time, and also hundred acres of woodland land lying on the south side of my shop place, which said one hundred acres is called
