

contact at all. This part of the
allegation is therefore worthless.
We do not pretend however to dis-
cuss his qualifications for the
position, but we do insist that
the relative fitness of the two par-
ties shall be judged by some other
standard. We must express our en-
tire inability to see how the rem-
ainder interests of the Petitioners -
could possibly be jeopardized if -
the trustee, no matter who he may
be, gives bond with good and suf-
ficient security. In conclusion -
we must however insist that the
Respondent is, by law, and by
the plainly expressed intent of her
grandfather, entitled to have
this property turned over to her di-
rectly, and she prays Your Honors
to pass an order to that effect.
