All all events, the Arthur Emory, who died
 in 1747, possessed and disposed of the ~~land~~ lands
 conveyed by Arthur Emory Sr. to ^{his son,} Arthur Emory Jr.
 in 1683 and 1692, from "natural love and affection" and
 for a provision of livelihood" etc. The Arthur of 1747 was
 evidently a man beyond middle age in 1723, for in that
 year he conveyed large tracts of land to several children,
 and had a son, John Emory Jr, born in 1698, died 1747,
 and also buried (near his father) at "Hemlocky". The
 Emory of 1747 was presumably the Arthur Emory
 who was a vestryman of St. Paul's Parish in 1700, a
 member of the County Court for the newly created County
 of Queen Anne's in 1708, etc. If my conclusion is correct
 he was born about 1666, and was over 80 years of age
 when he died in 1747. His tombstone shows that he
 had two wives - Anne, who died Nov. 10, 1724, and
 Catherine (Jacqueline) Littleton (Littleton, a family
 name later,) who survived him. He died July 25, 1747.

The will of Arthur Emory, executed July 25, 1747,
 probated Nov. 25, 1747, in presence of John Emory Jr.
 heir-at-law, shows that he left the following sons:
