Land office records at Annapolis (Liber 10 folio 391)

Show that Arthur Emory arrived in Maryland in the year 1666, with his wife, Mary, and two children.

From the copies of Talbot County wills in [Liber H, folio 269] at the Anne Arundel County Court house at Annapolis, it appears that "Arthur Emory, Senior" of Talbot County died in the year 1699, leaving sons—John, William, and Arthur, ~~and~~ a daughter, Ann, and a widow (presumably his second wife) Katherine. One of the witnesses to the will was Arthur Emory, junior. The widow seems to have married Edmund Prior. There is an account of Edmund Prior and Catharine (Katherine), his wife, as Executors of Arthur Emory, dated August 8 1701 and in a will dated April 15/47, Catharine Pryor (Prior) bequeaths certain property to her children, John Emory, senior, William Emory, Arthur Emory, Ann Glenden and William Pryor.

According to the Land Office records Arthur Emory, the immigrant, acquired certain lands known as Emory's Neglect, ^{etc.} on Wye River
