

now known to have been part of the tract owned by the Emory family near what is now the village of Queenstown in Queen Anne's County, and including the farms ~~now~~ ^{at present} owned by ~~the~~ Philemon J. Davidson, Robert Willson, Hiram Dudley and Louis Hergenrather, their names being "Green Spring" (or "Beverley"), "Warrington", ^{and "Emory's Fortune"} "Hensley" or "Ingle-side" and "The Four Chimneys".

Arthur Emory, who died in 1787 and lies buried at "Ingle-side", where his tomb-stone with its inscription, still legible, may be seen, was evidently the son of Arthur, the immigrant, who died in 1699, as he inherited part of the tract of land above described and bequeathed it, with other holdings, to his sons, Thomas, James, Gideon, John and Arthur. His daughters were, ^{Ann Sudler,} Sarah Carter, Juliana Kemp and Letitia Kirby. His widow was Jacqueline, who was buried in the same grave at "Ingle-side". Her name appears on the tombstone as L (J?) ^{Lockline} ~~Lockline~~ (evidently intended for Jacqueline) Littleton (Littleton). According to the same inscription, there was also buried in the same grave a former wife of Arthur,
