

marrried my uncle, John R. Emory of "Poplar Grove" and
is now living in Baltimore. This was ^{doubtless part of} "Warrington" now
owned by the Willsons.

Arthur Emory, son of Arthur who died in 1747,
and brother of John Emory jr, died in 1765, leaving
"Welsh Ridge" ~~to his son, Thomas,~~
with reversion to the latter's brother, Arthur, and "Hemsley"
(part of the same "Ingleide" tract as "Emory's Fortune") which was
given to me by deed of gift from my father and wherein
my brother John lately dwelt," to Arthur, who had already
been given the contiguous tract "Emory's Fortune," by the
will of his uncle, John.

This Arthur Emory, ^{son of Arthur and} great grandson of the
immigrant, 1666, died in 1801, leaving "Hemsley" and
"Emory's Fortune" ^{("Ingleide") and other tracts} to his son, John Wells Emory, and lands
on Broad Creek, Kent Island, and in Kent County to his Kent
Island

wife, Ann; to be divided afterwards between his sons,
Peregrine, James and Theodore. He also devised property
to his daughter, Margaret Sudlet.

John Wells Emory sold "Hemsley" ("Ingleide")
in 1817 to Richard Hall, reserving the graveyard [where Arthur
Emory (died 1747) and John Emory jr (died 1761) lie buried]
