My Dear Fred

Jno M. Emory left no will, died in-
testate about 1839, Mr Samuel Stevens was ap-
pointed Adm^r of his personal estate, and sold
the same to pay debts. The personal estate was
not sufficient for that purpose (about \$1300-
therefore Wm H. & Peregrine Groom, Merchants of Easton
filed a Bill in Equity asking that J. M. Emory's real
estate might be sold to pay his unpaid debts -
This was done in May 1840; Jas Lloyd Martin was
appointed Trustee & sold his farm of 359^A-0-39^{R. P.} to
Jno Stevens, his dwelling in Easton to S. B. Hopkins
No description or name of this farm given among
the papers - but I know it very well, it is
within 3 miles of Easton & is known to this day
as the "Emory Farm" & is owned now by Henry A. Nichols
of Easton, of course the farm has an ancient
name but I have forgotten it. If you wish to
