My dear son:

I was at Frederica this morning & saw John Emory. He told me that he had received a letter from Frederic Emory, but could not give him the information he desired. He seems to be ignorant of his ancestry. He says his father John Emory, whom I knew, could neither read or write. All he knows of his grandfather is that his name was Thomas. His father John Emory had eight sons & two daughters, but I suppose they are as ignorant of their ancestry as he is judging from what he says.

The tract of land referred to by Mr. Emory which was purchased by his Great Grandfather in 1780 and lying in the forest of Murderkill, ^{hundred} was probably in the vicinity of Hollandsville which by the nearest route is not more than five miles from the Chop-
Tank
