

Death of Mr. Albert T. Emory.

CENTREVILLE, Md., March 26. Mr. Albert T. Emory died last night of an affection of the heart, at the home of his niece, Mrs. Tilghman Davidson, in Queenstown, aged seventy-five years. Mr. Emory had been sick for some time, but had improved until last night, when he had a relapse and died in a short time. He was a son of the late Gen. Thomas Emory and brother of the late Col. John R. Emory. Mrs. Maria Robinson, widow of Judge Robinson, is his niece, and a number of his nephews are prominent in this county, among them being Mr. Blanchard Emory, the postmaster of Centreville, and Mr. E. B. Emory, of Poplar Grove.

Mr. Albert Emory married a Miss Winder, of Baltimore county, a number of years ago. He was a lawyer and practiced at the bar in Centreville, except a few years spent at Towson. At one time he served as State's attorney for this county and was long auditor of the court. He was a soldier in the Confederate army and saw much active service. He will be buried tomorrow at Poplar Grove. The pall-bearers will be Messrs. Blanchard Emory, E. H. Brown, W. T. P. Turpin, Tilghman Davidson, E. B. Emory and Dr. Charles Cockey.

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
