Philadelphia July 17th 1849

Henrietta's letter to Luise
concerning a check in my favour for
\$428. and one in Margaret's for \$82.50
was duly received. I send the Receipts
as requested by Henrietta for mine, Mar-
garet's I paid over to her. With regard to ap-
propriating any of Luise's Money
to the payment of poor Frisby's Debt, I can
not consent to it and would wish you
at once to have her Portion invested
in some safe way. The Account already
rendered against Frisby are upwards of \$140.
and still more to come. The Amount already
sent will cover all Debt that I feel bound
to pay unless I can do so with justice to my
Family. You will readily imagine what
a relief the money sent by you to Luise
has been when I tell you my situation
was such that the Night I got a letter from
Baltimore announcing poor Frisby's cri-
tical situation, I had to borrow \$10. to take
me to Baltimore which Money I have
only had it in my power to return out
of what you sent Luise. I am still trying
to procure employment but as yet see
no Prospect of doing so. Let me know if
