MR. SMITH: That would make it more awkward to

have other testimony or something else pending.

THE EXAMINER: We will close that bridge when we

come to it.

I desire to offer in evidence as Commissioner's Exhibit No. 788, a copy, certified from the records of the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Pennsylvania, under the Seal of the Clerk of that Court, Mr. J. The Aluminum Company of America, No. 159 in Equity, on to wit, the 7th day of June, 1913.
