MR. SMITH: May I ask now, if that is what you propose to prove, what is the purpose of that proof and what do you propose to establish by it?

MR. WHITELEY: Just as I have stated.

MR. SMITH: Will you please tell us what part of this complaint justifies your offer of that proof?

MR. WHITELEY: That part I read in the previous offer.
