a, b, c, d, and e, and none of these averments refer or even hint at any attempt to secure a monopoly in bauxite or any other raw material and the Examiner has only to read the paragraphs of the complaint relied upon by counsel for the Commission to see that this evidence is wholly immaterial and outside of the complaint.
