Q Who was Humphreys?

A He was the solicitor who obtained the option from Mrs.

Hubbard.

MR. SMITH: If the Examiner please, we object

to this witness telling us about these lawsuits which are matters of records and which can be proven properly and correctly in other ways. I have never heard of a witness

being allowed to testify the result of a lawsuit.

THE EXAMINER: The witness can tell the general

knowledge he has in reference to a lawsuit, Mr. Smith, and this is a matter of knowledge, if he has such knowledge. I don't think, Mr. Whitely, you are exceedingly interested in such detailed recital.

MR. WHITELY: I want to pursue it very briefly

and get the facts. I am not going to, of course, attempt

to prove any of the court records. I merely want this witness, who I understand has first-hand knowledge of these facts, as he was on the ground, to state them.

THE EXAMINER: My only concern is this, Mr.

Whitely, and that is that the Demarest Banknote Company is a foreign corporation not mentioned in this complaint.

MR. WHITELY: One hundred per cent subsidiary

of the Aluminum Company of America and part of that company.

MR. SMITH: Not a part of that company.
