

MR. WHITELEY: Agent of the company.

THE EXAMINER: I want to get the facts straight and I am going to let the witness testify.

MR. WHITELEY: I think the Examiner recalls that the Demerara Bauxite Company is a subsidiary of the Aluminum Company of America.

MR. SMITH: Counsel for the Commission has just said he proposed to find from this witness briefly the facts of these lawsuits. We submit that is incompetent and irrelevant, not to say unusual that the records of a court of justice be proven in this way and we therefore object to any such proof.

THE EXAMINER: I am going to let Mr. Emery testify to his knowledge of these suits. If it becomes necessary to get the court records in the cases, the attorney for the Commission can take the proper course to get them, if it is necessary in this case. But Mr. Emery you were on the ground and know about these lawsuits?

THE WITNESS: I was on the ground during the trial of these cases, in fact all of them, and I was in the court room practically every day, almost every hour while the cases were being heard.

THE EXAMINER: I am going to let you testify and limit you simply to your own knowledge acquired on that occasion as to the suits.
