

MR. SMITH: Your Honor will grant us an exception.

THE EXAMINER: Certainly.

BY MR. WHITELEY:

Q Who employed the solicitor who represented you on the proceedings?

A I employed the solicitor and barrister.

Q Will you tell us briefly, Mr. Emery, what the results of these trials were?

A The first case which came to trial in this chain of litigation was Humphreys v. Hubbard. The case was heard in April or May, 1930, and the decision was handed down in favor of Mrs. Hubbard about the 30th of June, - on or about the 30th of June, 1930.

The Demerara Bauxite Company then consented to the combining of several cases regarding the point of law into one case, which was known as the Demerara Bauxite Company v. Hubbard, Humphreys, and Emery, in other words, they brought all parties to the contract before the court. This case was heard in the fall of that year, either November or December and the verdict was rendered in Mrs. Hubbard's favor.

Q That was in 1930?

A I don't remember whether it was in 1930 or 1931, but I think it was in 1931.

Q I mean the trial took place in the fall?

A The trial started in the fall of 1930 and the case was
