MR. SMITH: And that does not include any conversations with officials of the Lands Office.

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THE EXAMINER: Leaving out anything with reference to them.

MR. SMITH: (Interrupting) I object to that and ask to have it stricken out.

THE WITNESS: Pardon me. I have the right to say what I saw.

MR. SMITH: I move to strike that.

THE EXAMINER: You have the right to give us simply what you know about these matters and what was told you by representatives of the Demerara people, themselves.

MR. SMITH: Major, that is suggesting to the witness something has been told to him, but he has not thought anything has been told to him by the Demerara Company. His evidence cannot be used against us unless it is shown we made the record.
