Dear Lloyd:

I have your letter of the 8th and you will receive this upon your return from Pocono.

We have no records of tomatoes shipped between 1908 and 1910 and there were only a few baskets of peaches in 1911 of which Mother has no detailed record. The Gibson note is due Sept. 21st and the amount of the note plus interest is \$65.96. The net proceeds from our part of the clover seed is \$24 after deducting the \$8 for threshing it.

It is Mother's intention to leave here Sunday the 14th. She will spend Monday night at Aunt Mamie's and go to Aunt Alice's on the Queenstown boat Tuesday. She expects to return to Aunt Mamie's on Friday and stay there a week going to Philadelphia by way of Newcastle on Saturday the 27th. She will probably spend two nights in Newcastle going on to Philadelphia on the 29th and taking up the duties of her new position. There will be a week's work for her in Philadelphia and then she will doubtless go to Peekskill, N. Y. for the remainder of the winter.

You will do well to see Mother upon her arrival in Philadelphia and go over carefully matters pertaining to the farm. If there is anything in the information I have given you which does not exactly check up then you will have this opportunity to refer to Mother's memory. Inasmuch as all of the business management of the farm after that date is to be in your hands it is of great importance that every little detail be known to you. All of the information which I have sent to you retaining copies of it for my files.

I think this arrangement of ours is going to work out very satisfactorily and our taking over the matter has been timely for many reasons. We will certainly put a quietus on any outside influence which does not
