This firm which has been in existence about six years, is composed of Wm. Bittles and L. D. Henderson. The former is a young man, about twenty-five years old. Was formerly a builder at which he accumulated a little money. The latter was previously in the commission business on Delaware Ave. Is about thirty years old. They formed a partnership about six years ago as stated above. Claim to carry on an extensive and profitable business. Carry a fair sized stock of horses, carriages, harness, etc., which they estimate to value approximately \$12,000. A great deal of the horses, etc., belong to other people. As a firm they own no real estate, but individually, "B" owns a property at N. W. c. 15th & Tasker Sts., which is assessed for \$7,500, which is encumbered and properties at 1002 and 1008 Miles St., which he estimates to value together \$12,000. These properties are also encumbered. Their stable is rented. "H" owns horses which he claims to have been offered \$7,500 for, but which he thinks "ought to be at least \$10,000. These steeds are insured for \$7,500. The other stock is also insured. All they owe, they assert, is \$2.50, which is for a small amount of merchandise. Claim to have no borrowed capital nor to have any notes out. Deposits are kept with the Northwestern National Bank, and the Commonwealth Title & Trust Co. Ask no credit of any one as they buy only on a cash basis.
