See that you don't work any day labor more
than enough to do the necessary work and then
give it early breakfasts and see that it goes to
work early and don't stand around until 8
or 9 o'clock waiting for some one to tell them what
to do - Of course you will have to get in wood and
straw and have the weeds taken out and the ground
