My Dear Mrs. Emory;-

In replying to your letter of the 24th. inst. I think that your suggestion of paying one half of the Green note and renewing the balance after August is a very good one and I would advise you to do it. Instead of making your note for two months I would make it for three months so by that time we will have the proceeds from the wheat and can have decided about borrowing enough money to pay off all of these notes.
