### —KENTUCKY'S GREAT— Stallion Representative Stake.

\$10,000

GUARANTEED.

\$10,000

For foals of 1890, colts, fillies and geldings (the get of stallions that may be nominated in this stake), to trot as three year-olds at Fall Meeting, 1893, mile heats, 3 in 5, in harness. On or before December 1, 1890, the stallions whose get may become eligible to start in 1893 must be nominated, and any stallion, even if dead, that has colts foaled in 1890 is eligible. Ten days prior to race the colts to represent the stallions shall be named, and there may be as many starters by one sire as there are different owners, but no person can be interested in more than one starter. The Association guaranteed this stake worth not less than \$10,000, except for a walk-over in which case the winner will receive whole of amount paid in. The guaranteed amount (\$10,000), will be divided: \$8,000 to first colt; \$1,250 to second; \$750 to third. If the stake exceeds \$10,000, the whole of excess will go to Nominator of stallion whose colt wins the race. Entered as follows: \$100 to name the stallion December 1, 1890. \$50 to name the colt ten days ahead of race in 1893, and \$100 the night before the race. Send entries to
