I send you by freight today my mare Almonta, record 2.37 full sire to Almoretta the mare I sent you about a year ago.

Almonta was bred in the Spring to Dr. Day's horse Kaiser, but she appears not to have caught and I therefore send her to be bred to Happy Russell at a service fee of one hundred dollars, good for service until July 1st, 1892.

I think you will find this mare in season as a friend of mine told me she was ready for the horse yesterday.

You will find Almonta not very high in flesh as she has been running on grass and is naturally not an easy keeper.

I would like to have her kept in box stall and grained, while she remains at your place.

Please do not give her dry, dusty hay, but have hay well sprinkled and would not object to having some good corn fodder thrown into her.

I do not care to have her driven as it is not the time of year for track work and she is rather nervous for road use.
