EGBERT PUTS ANOTHER IN THE LIST,

Considerable interest was taken in the match trotting race for \$100 a side which took place at the Belmont Driving Club, yesterday afternoon between the chestnut stallion Lyndon. Owned by Mr. George D. Wetherill, Clearview Farm, Bellevue, Delaware, and the bay gelding Hambrine Prince, driven by Mr. George Scattergood.

Lyndon was driven by Mr. Thomas Grady, lessee of the track and won in three straight heats.

Lyndon is a chestnut stallion, 16¼ hands high. and is by Egbert, the sire of so many horses lately entering the 2.30 list. His dam is by Manbrino Time, making him a brother in blood to the celebrated Temple Bar. 2.17¾, lately ruled off the Association tracks after winning many large purses and stakes.

Another match race took place at the same time between Mr. J. H. Meredith's bay mare Little Maid. and J. B. Green's bay stallion, Chantilly. Little Maid won this race taking the first, third and fourth heats in 2.36, 2.35½, 2.32½.
