

**HAPPY RUSSELL IN THE STUD.**—When the fast filly Happy Bee made her record at Dover, Del., of 2:29 $\frac{3}{4}$ , attention was drawn to the fact that her sire, Happy Russell, was only five years old. Edward B. Emory, the owner of Happy Russell, announces that his stud fee from March 1 to July 1, 1890, will be \$100, but that all mares served before that time will be only charged \$50, and will have the usual privilege of return. Mares bred to him can be kept at Poplar Grove during the Winter months at \$8 per month. Happy Russell, 4494, is by Mambrino Russell, 2008, dam Odd Stocking, by Happy Medium, 400; 2d dam County House Mare (dam of Nettie 2:18), by American Star, 14. It will be seen at a glance that he is grandly bred, and his ability to reproduce speed has already been fully proved.
