

the lands of Edward B. Emory, A. P. Weedon,
the lands belonging to the Heirs at Law or devisees
of James R. Purdie, deceased, and others, and
divided into two parcels, as follows, to wit:
St. 1. Beginning at a stone, where this land
corners with adjoining land, belonging to
Edward B. Emory, and running thence, South
twenty-three and a quarter degrees West twenty
perches, thence South four and three quarter
degrees East, eleven perches, thence South, forty
six and a quarter degrees, West nineteen
perches, thence South forty nine degrees,
West twenty nine, and a half perches to
the Mitchell Lot, thence with the lines of said
lot, South seventy seven and a quarter degrees
East twenty five perches, thence South five
degrees, West twenty two and two fifths perches,
thence North, eighty two degrees, West thirty
seven and three fifths perches, to the outcrops
of the whole tract, near the stream of the
Branch, thence up the Branch, South forty
nine degrees and a quarter of a degree, East
Eighty perches to the Booker Lot, thence
with said lot, North twelve degrees East
thirty four and two fifths perches, thence
North fifty two degrees, East ten and a half
perches, thence South Eighty nine, and a half
