Dear Mother

You may expect a chilly letter this time. For we caught a "norther" this morning. It was 10° below zero when I got up, & the wind blowing about forty miles an hour. We have thawed it out to twenty-eight inside of the tent by now & at present we are all huddling the stove. I have not received any mail since I wrote to you Tuesday. We have gotten so far from town that it takes two days for the round trip.

I have been working hard on office work all the week.

I had a doctor look at my leg yesterday & he says he thinks I will be out by Tuesday. This is the last abscess I care about having. It is so very hard to get clean things to dress it with.

But I hope not to have any set backs. Things have been very quiet so I have not any information at present. I will wait until after we get the mail & maybe I will hear from you
