

Act of June 27, 1890.

Declaration for Dependent Father's Pension.

NOTICE.—This application may be sworn to before a JUSTICE OF THE PEACE, NOTARY PUBLIC, or before a Clerk of Court.—If the Justice or Notary has no seal, the Clerk of the County Court must add his certificate of official character hereon, and NOT ON A SEPARATE SLIP OF PAPER.

On this 29th day of August, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, personally appeared before me, A Justice of the Peace of the court, the same being a Court of Record within and for the county and State aforesaid James W Parker, aged 45 years, a resident of the 4th dist of Howard State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the father of Joseph Parker, who enlisted under the name of Joseph Parker at Washington, on the 14th day of June A. D. 1863, in Company D, 1st Regiment of U S (Cold) troops (Here state rank, company, and regiment, if in Military service, or vessel, if in Navy.) was discharged from the service at the expiration of the time on May 24th 1865. Enlisted again on the 8th day of May 1867 in the regular army in the late War of the Rebellion, who died at Fort Concho, Texas, on the 20th day of January 1882, from the effects of disease of the heart incurred at , on the day of , 18

That said son left neither widow, nor child under sixteen years of age, surviving. That declarant was married to the mother of said son on the 17th day of July, 1841 at Mr. Wm R. Warfields in Howard Co. By John Freeman and that she died on the 12th day of June, 1891 at Daisy Howard Co, Md. That he is without other PRESENT means of support than his own manual labor, or the contributions of others not legally bound for his support. That he has applied for a pension, the number of his application being . That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.

He hereby appoints A Parlett Lloyd of Baltimore Md his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim, and agrees to pay his said attorney a fee of Ten Dollars upon the allowance of the claim.
