the City wharves in other words he did what small work he could
get some times opened oysters in private houses. - First place he lived
after leaving the army was in Park between Clay & Saratoga (this was before the
opening of the street) then was two years & six months on Hill street between Howard
& Sharp does not remember the number, then on Vine street nearly the
same time, then on 47 S. Sharp street some fourteen years it was be-
tween Lexington & Clay street, then on Jasper street (thinks) 79 old number
remained there some three years ^{since} at his present abode. Has never
treated by a regular Physician until last fall (about October or
November 1886) when he was treated by Dr. John Jay who lived on Franklin
street between Park & Howard North side - He supposes said Dr Jay is also
before & since then he has been only treated from Drug Stores - He has
lost on an average one half of his time he has been for seven or
eight weeks unable to do any work at a time.
