Lucilla Waters, who, being by me first duly sworn to  
 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this special  
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

I am 35 years of age; my post-office address is 1320 McCallough  
St. City. I am a cousin of the claimant. I  
 am out to service - not married.

I am too young to know about the claimant's  
 marriage. I was born in Somerset County, near  
 where claimant was born, but have lived here  
 in Baltimore since I was a child. I have  
 never lived with her but visit her house frequently  
 and have known her and her husband Samuel  
 Johnson ever since I knew any one. They were  
 never separated or divorced while I knew  
 them. I know nothing as to whether her husband  
 was ever previously married. I never heard  
 that he was married prior to his marriage  
 to this claimant. She has not remarried  
 and owns no property of any kind and has no  
 income from any source except her labor.  
 I have made an affidavit in this case.
