Personally came before me, a Justice of the Peace in and for aforesaid County
and State, Henry Stoneman, aged 44 years

citizen of the Town of , County of Howard, State of Maryland

 , well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who,
being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid case, as follows:

I was a private soldier
in "D" 1st M.S.C.T., knew John Conner, who enlisted in
the same Company and Regiment under the name of
Robert Siddeman, I was a slave and belonged to the
same man. We were raised together, and at the time
of our enlistment was a sound, strong, and healthy
young man, never knew him to be sick till we were
advancing toward Petersburg in 1864. He then
complained of severe pains in his side and small of
the back, and of great difficulty in making water.

After our discharge
in 1865 I lived for 13 years in Baltimore and when I would
see the deceased soldier almost daily. After my removal to
the country, he would occasionally visit us, in all the
years from our discharge in 1865, till he died he was never
able to do any hard work was always complaining of
his back, and difficulty in making water.

The widow has
not remarried and the children were living
this day March 18th 1890. That is Mary E. and John H.

I further declare that I have no interest in said case, and am not concerned in
its prosecution.
