CC DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION. CC

STATE OF Maryland COUNTY OF Baltimore SS:

On this 23 day of July A. D., 1898, personally appeared before me the undersigned, duly authorized to administer oaths within the County and State aforesaid, Florence Scott aged 28 years, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Philip Scott who enlisted under the name of Philip Scott in Co. B of the 30 Regiment of 25th Vols. and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, who was honorably discharged and died on the second day of July 1898

That she was married to said soldier under the name of Florence Bee on the second day of April 1890, by John Scott Minister at Baltimore there being no legal barrier to said marriage.

She had never been married before

If claimant or her husband was previously married, state how it was dissolved. Or if neither were not married before so state here.

That she has not remarried since the death of said soldier above named and is without other means of support than her daily labor. That the names and dates of birth of all the children now living under sixteen years of age of the said soldier are as follows:

That she has She has never made Application for Pension before

Lockwood, of Washington, D. C., her attorney to prosecute this claim and agrees to pay him a fee of ten dollar therefor if successful. That her Post Office address is

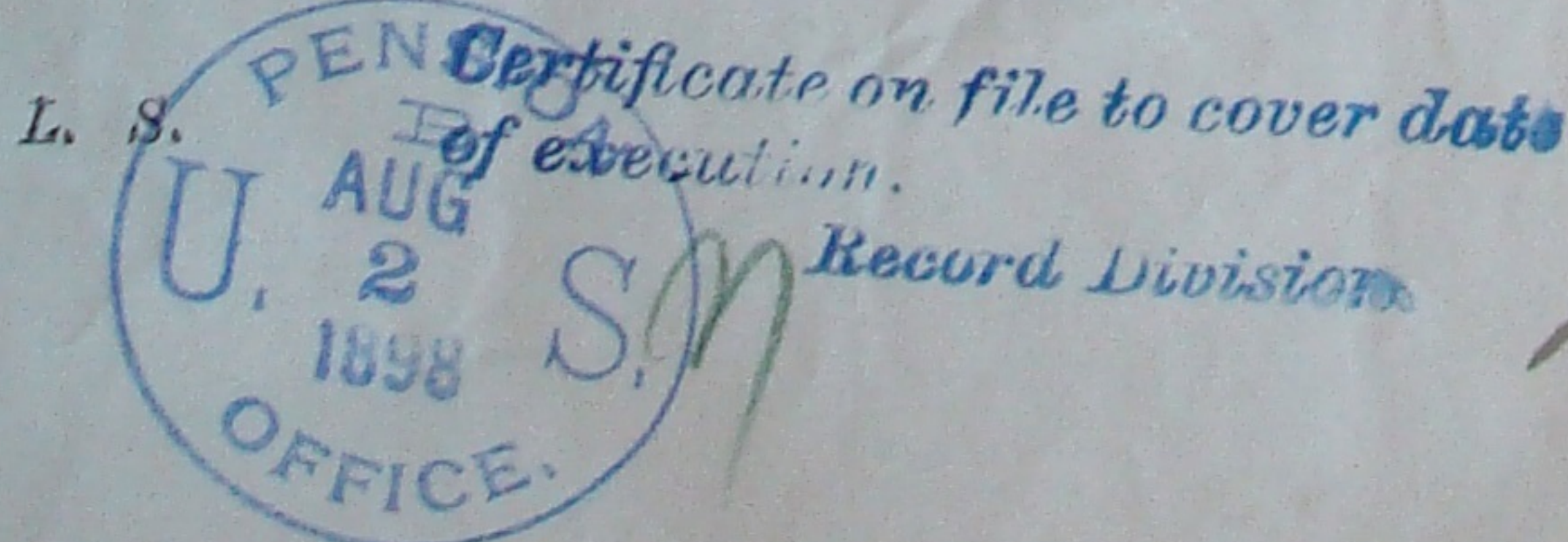
