The claim also requires the sworn testimony of two credible witnesses who knew the soldier during the period from the date of death of his former wife, Mary, to date of his marriage to you, showing whether he had been married during said period other than to Louisa, and, if so, how and when such other marriage or marriages terminated.

There is also required the sworn testimony of some credible witness who knew your former husband, Horace Lewis, from the time he attained military age, showing whether he served in the army or navy of the United States, and, if so, the full designation of such service should be furnished together with your affidavit showing whether you ever applied for pension as his widow.

You are further advised that in soldier's claim for pension under the Act of May 11, 1912, filed May 15, 1912, his age was given as 66 years, the date of his birth appearing as March 4, 1845 or 1840, while in the certificate of his death, filed April 9, 1915, the date of death of one, William T. Richardson, is shown as March 3, 1915, and his age as 48 years. This discrepancy
