

ACT OF APRIL 19, 1908.—AMENDED BY ACT OF SEPTEMBER 8, 1916.

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

To be executed before a Court of Record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal, a Notary Public, or Justice of the Peace, whose official signature shall be verified by his official seal, and in case he has none, his signature and official character shall be certified by a Clerk of a Court of Record, or a City or County Clerk.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, ss:

On this 11 day of Sept, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and 16, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public within and for the County and State aforesaid, Mary E. Richardson (Notary, Justice, or Clerk of Court.) (Insert name of applicant.) aged 43 years, a Col. 1873 resident of Baltimore County of Baltimore, State of Maryland.

who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of William Richardson (Name of Soldier), who enlisted under the name of William Richardson (Name under which soldier enlisted.)

on the 11 day of Sept, A. D. 1873, as a U. S. C. in Company B, in the 19 Regiment of U. S. C. (Here state rank.) (Letter of Company.) (No. of Regiment.)

and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED.

and died March 3, 1915 That he was employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above. (Date of Discharge.) (Date of death; cause need not be stated.)

(Here state what the service was, whether prior or subsequent to that stated above, and the dates at which it began and ended.)

That he was not employed in the military or naval service of the United States otherwise than as stated above. That she was married under the name of Mary E. Lewis

to said William Richardson on the 16 day of September A. D. 1904, by Rev. Dr. Brown at Baltimore there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that she had been previously married; that her said husband had been previously married. (4) claimant previously married to Horace Lewis, who died at Alexandria, Va., on July 14, 1896. Soldier previously married to Louisa Richardson, who died Jan. 1, 1904, at Baltimore, Md.

That she has not remarried since the death of the said William Richardson (Name of soldier or sailor.)

That the names and dates of birth of all the children of the soldier, now living, and under sixteen years of age, are as follows: none

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That A prior application for pension has been filed by herself or the soldier. (A or no.)

Application by claimant U. D. 1, 045, 130 Soldier died by act of 1, 018, 050 (If prior application has been filed, either by soldier or widow, so state, giving number assigned to it.)

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the act of April 19, 1908, amended by act of September 8, 1916.

She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, Lloyd Odend'hal of Baltimore, Md.

her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim, the fee to be TEN DOLLARS, payable as prescribed by law.
