On this 25th day of April, 1902, at
Baltimore City, county of _____
State of Maryland, before me, A.H. Davis, a
special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared
Charles R. Favour, who, being by me first duly sworn to
answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special
examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says: I am 61
years old, occupation Clerk in the Baltimore
City Post Office and my residence & P.O.
address is Sykesville, Carroll Co. Md.
I knew Henry Nelson about twenty
years. He lived in the vicinity of
Sykesville in Carroll and Howard
Counties, Maryland, and for about
eighteen years I judge he lived
with a colored woman named
Annie Lewis, and had five or
six children by her.
I supposed he was married to
her until after his death, when
Annie told me that she had never
been married to Henry Nelson.
Henry Nelson died while living
with this woman Annie in Howard
County near Sykesville, Md. and I
saw his dead body. He died
about eighteen months ago, but
I do not remember the exact date.
I have no interest in this claim.
I have read this deposition and it
is correct.
