

in her claim. I have heard you read my affidavit (B.J. 8) and I now remember that I was groomsman at the marriage of Ellen to Henry Nelson. I did not know any names but Henry for him - didn't know that William was any part of his name. I think the date given in my affidavit, April 1868, is also correct, but I had no personal knowledge that neither of them had never been previously married and that they were not divorced, and I don't know whether she has married again or not. Those statements were put in my affidavit without my knowledge and I didn't know I was swearing to them. I have no interest in this claim. You have read this deposition to me and it is correct.
