I knew Henry Nelson from the day
of his discharge from the 4th Regt.
U.S.C. Inf. continuously till his death.

I did not know him before his
enlistment. I know that he was
a single man when he was dis-
charged from the service and lived
with his father and mother in this
City.

I knew when he married
Ellen, this Claimant, and know
that he was never previously
married. I don't know just
how long they lived together as
husband & wife, but long enough
to have at least four children.

He left her when these children
were small, and now they are
all grown.

I know that
they were never divorced, for
if they had been I would have
known something about it.

I have known Ellen, this Claim-
ant ever since her husband left
her and know she has not re-
married, but kept soldiers
children together and worked for
