and Samuel O. Henson aged 47 years,

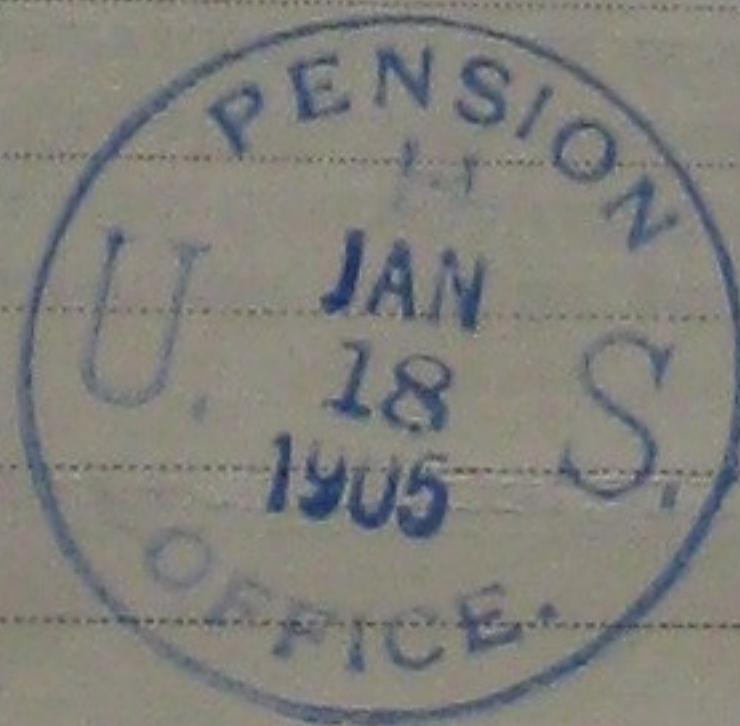
