Similar testimony is given by James Wilson and Thomas H. Jones of Baltimore, Md. in their affidavit of Aug. 11, 1897, wherein they testify to an acquaintance with Henry Robinson of 33 and 9 years respectively.

Alfred Moore and Alexander Shandor of Baltimore, Md. testified April 8, 1901, that they have known Henry Robinson for 15 and 30 years, and believe him to be the identical person he represents himself to be.
