

DEPOSITION *A.*

Case of *Henry Robinson* No. *708,293*

On this *23<sup>rd</sup>* day of *May*, 189*4*, at *Balti. City*, County of *...* State of *Md.*, before me, *Geo. Cunniff* a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *Henry Robinson*, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer

truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: *My age is 46; occupation, laborer; P. O. address, No. 412 Orchard St. Balt. City, Md.*

*I enlisted as a priv. in Co. E. 30<sup>th</sup> U. S. C. I can't give the date of enlistment and discharge; I can't even give the year; I was in the service two years and eight months. I was never in any other service.*

*I am a pensioner, drawing \$10 per month for <sup>under Act of June 27, 1890</sup> limb loss and dyspepsia; I am paid from Washington (D. C.) Agency on Ch. No. 708,293. I have an application on file for increase in amount of remuneration, catarrh in head, neuralgia, kidney disease and pain in back. All of these diseases originated since my service, though I felt bad at times in the service. I had no treatment for anything in service, except for a heavy cold, for by ~~the~~ *Dr. Ruf. Jackson*, at *Bermuda Hundred, Va.* just before I was discharged.*

*I never made any claim for pension until the passage of the Act of June 27, 1890. I applied just after President Harrison*
