Here give a full description of the disabilities, in accordance with Book of instructions, and make a separate paragraph for each disability.

Rheumatism: He has no deformity or limitation of motion of joints. He complains of muscular pains over his whole body. He stoops over and recovers himself with evident pain and difficulty, owing, he claims to severe pain and soreness in his lumbar muscles and muscles of thighs. His movements indicate that he suffers as alleged.

Heart is normal in size, function and position. He has no edema, cyanosis or dyspnoea.

He has no disease of Lungs. Chest symmetrical; expiration 32, rest 33, inspiration 35.

His kidneys are in healthy condition. Urine amber. S. G. 1020. Acid. No sugar or albumen.

No other disability found to exist.

He presents no evidences of syphilitic infection or other vicious habits.

We find that the aggregate permanent disability for earning a support by manual labor is due to Muscular Rheumatism, not due to vicious habits, and warrants a rating of \$8.00.

Whenever a disability is shown or is believed to be due to or aggravated by vicious habits the opinion of the board must be stated. When not due to such habits this fact must be stated.

When rates are recommended solely on subjective evidence the strongest reasons must be given therefor.
