

Declaration for Widow's Pension.

ACT OF APRIL 19, 1908. AS AMENDED SEPTEMBER 8, 1916.

State of Maryland County of Baltimore SS:

On this 2nd day of December, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and Eighteen

personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, Mary Robinson

Who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain a pension, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved April 19, 1908, amended September 8, 1916.

declares that she is about years of age, that she was born about, 1847, at Clarksdale

The she is the widow of Henry Robinson, who was

Enrolled under the name of Henry Robinson

on the 30th day of Sept, 1864, as a private in Co. F

30th Reg't M. S. C. Inf. Vols., and honorably discharged Dec, 1865, having served ninety days or more during the late Civil War.

That she was married under the name of Mary Stewart to said soldier

at Howard Co on the 23rd day of April, 1870, by Rev. H. F. Griffin Priest; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage;

that she had not been previously married; That the soldier had not been previously married

(If there was a prior marriage of either the date and place of death or divorce of former consort or consorts should be stated.) that neither she nor said soldier married otherwise than as stated above.

That the said soldier died November 12th, 1918, at Baltimore City that she was not divorced from him; that she has not remarried since his death.

That the said soldier left the following-named children who are now living and under 16 years of age, to wit:

That the above-named child is of the soldier (or sailor) is now receiving a pension, and that such child is a member of her family and is cared for by her.
