I enlisted in Co K 9th SCY in the fall
 of 1863 and served over 3 years.

I was with my company most of the time.
 I was not acquainted with Joseph Shipley
 before going into the service. I had an
 opportunity of knowing him well during that
 time. He appeared to be a hearty well man
 when I first knew him. He was made orderly
 sergt on the field, as far as I can recollect
 he served as our orderly to the time of discharge
 and was able to do the duties of the position.
 I don't remember of his being sick at any time.
 I never noticed any thing about him that would
 indicate that his mind was affected in any way.
 Never knew of his being crazy. I know he did
 his full duty as our orderly sergt to time of discharge.
 Never heard any thing about him since our
 discharge & don't know if he is living or dead.
