Hamilton H. Daskill, who, being by me first duly sworn to
 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says: That he is
 age is 61 years; post-office address, as above
 ; occupation, laborer

I enlisted in Co K 9 USC in Nov 1863
 and served three years. was with my
 company all the time. did not know this
 soldier before I met him in the service.
 He had two brothers in the same company
 by name of Moses & Will. I remember his
 being sick but can't say what it was.
 was not away at hospital. don't know
 how long he was sick don't know what
 was the matter with him. have not heard
 anything about him since the war.
 I never noticed anything about him like
 his mind was affected. there was nothing
 strange about his actions that I ever noticed.
 I went to Texas with the regt and came
 back with them he did his duty as orderly
 sergt to time of discharge. I don't know
 anything about his going crazy - I never
 saw anything about him like it. I think
 I would have known it if there had been any
 sign of it for I have a good recollection &
 can recall most that happened during service.
 He did not have any bad habits - was never
 seen drunk while in the service. of good habit
 and was a kind orderly.
