

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

ACT OF JUNE 27, 1890.

To be executed before any officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes in the State, city, or county where said officer resides. If such officer has a seal and uses it upon such paper, no certificate of a county clerk or prothonotary or a clerk of a court shall be necessary; but when no seal is used by the officer before whom the declaration is executed, then a clerk of a court of record or a county or city clerk shall affix his official seal thereto, and shall certify to the signature and official character of said officer.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, ss:

On this 2^d day of November, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety three

personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and State aforesaid,

aged 51 years, a resident of the County of Carroll of Maryland, who, being duly sworn

according to law, declares that she is the widow of Henry Cure, who enlisted

under the name of Henry Cure, at Washington, D.C.

on the 10th day of May, A. D. 1863, in Co E 1st Regt.

U. S. C. Troops, as Private.

and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, who was

honorably discharged 29th Sept. 1865 and died October 30th 1893.

That she was married under the name of Caroline Adams to said Henry Cure on the December 1859

according to the methods then recognized in slave times both the claimant and her deceased husband having been slaves on adjoining plantations. That the claimant and her deceased husband lived together as man and wife ever since but they were legally married Jan 12th 1893. no former marriage

That she has not remarried since the death of the said Henry Cure. Name of soldier or sailor.

That she is without other means of support than her daily labor; that names and dates of birth of all the children now living under sixteen years of age of the soldier are as follows:

No Children under 16 years

That her husband has not been employed in the Military or Naval service otherwise than as stated above.

That she has not heretofore applied for pension and the number of her former application is but her deceased husband was a Pensioner under Act No. 827943

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.

She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, Geo. W. F. Vernon

State of Maryland, her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim, and to receive therefor a fee of ten dollars; that her post-office address is Carroll
