

Headquarters Co. D 39th U.S.C.T. Inf.
Carlisle Co N.C.
August 23, 1865

I Hiram Parker Capt. 39th U.S.C.T. on paper, certify that
Charles Daisey Pvt. Co. D, 39th U.S.C.T. deceased was when
I joined the Company April 29 1864 apparently
a stout and healthy man and able to perform
all the duties of a soldier. - From Sgt. Richard Day's
member of said Co. I learn that said soldier's health
was good up to the time he died. - Said Charles Daisey
served with his Company under me in active campaigning in the
Army of the Potomac from May 4 1864 to the latter part
of July 1864. During this time he was afflicted with a severe
felon on one finger but he suffered it heroically and it
did not hinder him from doing his full share of duty as a
soldier. In the latter part of July 1864 said soldier
was afflicted with diarrhea and "dizziness in the head".
My knowledge of the above facts is obtained from the following
source: and being unable to do duty was on the 9th day of
August 1864 sent to Hospital. After this he was
never well though he was with his Co. part of the
time and did duty. Said soldier's habits were good
and in my opinion his disease was contracted
in the line of duty as a soldier. -
