Dear Sir and Madam:-

You are hereby notified that the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore desire to acquire for the purpose of augmenting and improving the municipal water supply of Baltimore City all that portion of your property situate in Baltimore County, known as "Hampton", the whole of which is described in a decree dated Oct., 1906, and recorded among the land records of Baltimore County, Dec. 17, Fol. 52, the portion thereof required being shown on the annexed plat, containing $49\frac{1}{2}$ acres, more or less, and for which the said Mayor and City Council of Baltimore hereby offer you \$150.00 per acre.

And you are hereby notified that unless an agreement of sale is reached between you and the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore on or before the 30th day of April 1912, the said Mayor and City Council of Baltimore will institute condemnation proceedings for the purpose of acquiring your interest in said property.
